

DID YOU KNOW?

Each lesson helps you lead your family through four sections.

I GODS WORD:

Spending time together in God's Word is a powerful way for your kids to learn who God is while instilling a love for the Bible from an early age. Take some time to read the passage above together and then read and answer the questions in the following devotional.

CREATE or GAME TIME:

Sometimes the best conversations happen around creating or playing together. Don't' forget to make this time engaging and purposeful.

WORSHIP RESPONSE:

Worship Response is a time to respond in a posture and attitude of worship toward God. There are many ways we can actively give our worship to God.

BLESS:

A blessing can be a prayer of commission, a Bible passage, or words of encouragement. Blessings can be spoken over a child for the purpose of declaring God's protection, joy, and wisdom over him

ENVIRONMENTS

The order of the 10 Environments listed coincides with the monthly distribution of this resource.

STORYTELLING

"God has a big story, and I can be a part of it!"

The power of The Big God Story impacts our lives by giving us an accurate and awe-inspiring perspective into how God has been moving throughout history. It is the story of redemption, salvation and hope, and tells how I have been grafted into it by grace. It further compels us to see how God is using every person's life and is creating a unique story that deserves to be told for God's glory.

2 IDENTITY

"I belong to God, and He loves me!"

This environment highlights who we are in Christ. According to Ephesians 1, we have been chosen, adopted, redeemed, sealed, and given an inheritance in Christ all of which we did nothing to earn. This conviction allows children to stand firm against the destructive counteridentities the world will offer.

OUT OF THE COMFORT ZONE

5

"God transforms me when I step out in faith."

As children and students are challenged to step out of their comfort zone from an early age, they learn to experience a dependence on the Holy Spirit to equip and strengthen them beyond their natural abilities and desires. We believe this environment will cultivate a generation that, instead of seeking comfort, seeks a radical life of faith in Christ.

LOVE AND RESPECT

"God fills me with His love so I can give it away."

Without love, our faith becomes futile. This environment recognizes that children need an environment of love and respect in order to be free to both receive and give God's grace. Innate to this environment is the value that children are respected because they embody the image of God. We must speak to them, not at them, and we must commit to an environment where love and acceptance are never withheld due to one's behavior.

FAITH COMMUNITY

"God's family cares for each other and worships God together."

God designed us to live in community and to experience Him in ways that can only happen in proximity to one another. The faith community serves to create an environment to equip and disciple parents, to celebrate God's faithfulness, and to bring a richness of worship through tradition and rituals, which offer children an identity. Our love for each other reflects the love we have received from God.

6 RESPONSIBILITY

"God has entrusted me with the things and people He created around me."

This environment captures the ability to take ownership for one's life, gifts, and resources before God. A child must be challenged to take responsibility for his or her brothers and sisters in Christ, as well as for those who are spiritually lost. Our hope is that the Holy Spirit will use this environment to allow each child to understand that God has entrusted His world to us.

KNOWING

"God knows me, and I can know Him."

Nothing could be more important than knowing and being known by God. We live in a world that denies absolute truth, and yet God's Word offers just that. As we create an environment that upholds and displays God's truth, we give children a foundation based on knowing God, knowing His Word, and a relationship with Him through Christ. God is holy, mighty, and awesome, and yet He has chosen to make Himself known to

4 **SERVING**

"Asks the question, 'What needs to be done?'"

This posture of the heart asks the question, "What needs to be done?" It allows the Holy Spirit to cultivate a sensitivity to others and focuses on a cause bigger than one individual life. It helps fulfill the mandate that as Christfollowers we are to view our lives as living sacrifices that we generously give away!

COURSE CORRECTION

"When I get off track, God offers me a path of healing."

This environment flows out of Hebrews 12:11-13 and is the direct opposite of punishment. Instead, biblical discipline for a child encompasses a season of pain, the building up in love, and a vision of a corrected path for the individual with the purpose of healing at its core

MODELING

"I see Christ in others, and they can see Him in me."

Biblical content needs a practical living expression in order for it to be spiritually impacting. This environment serves as a hands-on example of what it means for children to put their faith into action. Modeling puts flesh on faith and reminds us that others are watching to see if we live what we believe.

LESSON ONE

GOD'S WORD

Jesus Serves

GOD STATEMENT: Jesus is the Suffering Servant

SCRIPTURE: Mark 8:34, 9:35 and 10:42-45

November has arrived and Thanksgiving is approacing quickly! Are you thinking of warm gatherings full of delicious family recipes and traditions with friends? Often these times include remembering what we are grateful for

delicious family recipes and traditions with friends? Often these times include remembering what we are grateful for and celebrating growth in Christ. It's true that as believers in Jesus, we really do desire to be more like Him.

For this lesson, let's shine a light on the book of Mark. Mark highlighted Christ as the Suffering Servant three specific times. He wrote that Jesus told the diciples He must suffer, die and rise three days later. After each announcement, a challenge is given to followers to also serve others. Wow! Take a moment to thank Jesus for being our Suffering Servant and ask for the Holy Spirit to teach you as we look at the serving challanges.

Let's spend time reading these verses and talking through the discussion questions.

READ:

- Mark 8:34
- Mark 9:35
- Mark 10:42-45

DISCUSSION:

- 1. What are the three serving challanges?
- 2. Are there ways your family is serving others? Praise the Lord for these!
- 3. Is there an oppourtunity this holiday season to be a servant? Pray and ask the Spirit "what needs to be done?" You'll have more time to reflect in the worship response.

CREATE

Tabletop Firepit



Jesus knew what needed to be done while He was on earth because he spent time with God. In Mark 1:35 we read:

³⁵ Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed.

Each time your family uses this CREATE project, remember Jesus praying in the dark seeking HisFather's will.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- 1 bag of concrete mix (not fast drying)
- 1 galvanized planter from the dollar tree

- item the shape of desired well, like a block of wood or cup.
- duct tape
- 1 bowl to mix concrete

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- 1. Wrap the wood block or item of choice with duct tape and spray with cooking spray.
- 2. Mix enough concrete to fill your planter almost full.
- Spray your planter with cooking spray for easy release once concrete is dry.
- 4. Pour concrete into planter.
- 5. Place the wooden block in the center of the planter and press down two inches to create the fire fluid well.
- 6. Let dry for three days.
- 7. After the concrete is fully dry, remove wooden block and turn planter over to release the metal form.

The Jesus Way WORSHIP RESPONSE

As believers of Jesus, we like to follow in his footsteps. After sunset, grab a blanket for each family member and re-read Mark 1:35. Spend a few minutes quietly listening and allowing the Holy Spirit to speak. Then leave the house together by walking outside to a private place. One parent can then play *The Jesus Way* by Phil Wickham.

After your quiet time, encourage each other to write down anything the Lord shared. If they did not hear anything, that's okay! Sometimes we hear a word and sometimes we're simply still before God as an act of worship.

Gather around the newly hardned tabletop firepit.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- graham cracker squares, chocolate bar of choice and marshmellows
- · scewers
- lighter
- · isopropyl alcohol for fire fluid

WHAT YOU'LL DO:

- 1. Place all the supplies on the table for smores
- 2. Pour isopropyl alcohol in the fire well and light with lighter.
- 3. Share what any family member has heard from the Lord while making smores together. Thank Jesus again for coming into the world to serve and give His life for many. This means we can now have eternal life!

A Believe

A blessing can be a prayer of commission, a Bible passage, or words of encouragement. Blessings can be spoken over a child for the purpose of declaring God's protection, joy, and wisdom over her.

SCRIPTURE: Mark 12:29-31

BLESSING:(Child's name), may you choose to believe Jesus is the Messiah and follow Him by serving others. May you remember His goodness to you as you grow in Love for the Lord your God and others.

LESSON TWO

GOD'S WORD

There Is Much to Do!

GOD STATEMENT: Jesus Is Worthy

SCRIPTURE: Scripture: Luke 10:38-42, Psalm 46:10

One day Jesus came to Bethany and visited Mary and Martha, the sisters of Lazarus. Martha, the oldest, was busy with cooking, cleaning, and preparing food, for the thirteen unexpected guests that had just shown up at her door. At the thought of Jesus and his disciples coming for dinner I'm positive the first question Martha asked herself was "What needs to be done?" I mean, if Jesus wanted to spend time at your house, wouldn't you want your home to be perfect?

During the holidays it is easy to be busy. Cooking and serving meals, decorating, buying presents, preparing for guests, it's all a part of the excitement. However, we mustn't be so busy that we forget the true reason for the season. Remember Mary, Martha's sister? Mary sat at the feet of Jesus and listened to what He had to say. She took a moment to be still. In Psalm 46:10 the Bible says, "Be still, and know that I am God!" When Martha asked

Jesus to tell Mary to help her, Jesus responded with "you are worried and upset about many things, but few things are needed-or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."

Jesus doesn't reprimand Martha or tell her that she chose the wrong thing. Serving others is not wrong, however Jesus says that Mary chose the better thing in that moment. Mary took time out to be still and know. There must be a balance, it is good to serve and remember why we serve. This holiday season remember to take time to be still, give thanks, and enjoy the blessings right in front of you.

DISCUSSION:

- 1. What did Jesus mean when He said, "Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her?"
- 2. What does the Bible mean in Psalm 46:10 to "Be still and know that I am God!"?
- 3. What can you do this holiday season to "Be still"?

GAME TIME

Big Things First

This activity is a fun experiment and an important lesson that teaches us about priorities. Practice ahead of time by yourself, so you have the correct quantities when doing the activity with your child.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- · big rocks
- pebbles
- sand
- water
- · a jar or large cup

Scripture: Matthew 6:33

Pray: Lord, we know we get busy at times but please help us to keep our eyes set on You. Help us first seek Your will before our own.



WHAT YOU'LL DO:

- First ask your child to fit the items into the jar or cup, from the smallest to largest.
- 2. The jar should be too full to fill in all the rocks.
- 3. Next repeat the activity with the largest items first until everything fits.
- Talk to your child about how we must put God first in our lives.

3 Thankful Wall Worship Response

READ:

Philippians 4:8

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- · string hung on your wall or bulletin board
- thumbtacks
- clothespins
- scrap paper
- pictures of family and friends
- pen or pencil

PRAY:

Lord thank you for the blessings You've given to us. We come to You in prayer Lord, that we focus on the good things and not the stress or worries of the season.

WHAT YOU'LL DO:

- 1. Read Philippians 4:8 and discuss with your family
- 2. Write down the blessings in your life and things you are thankful for on the pieces of scrap paper
- 3. Hang the string on your wall or bulletin board using thumbtacks
- 4. Hang your blessings, thanksgivings, and photos on the string using the clothespins



4 Trust BLESSING

A blessing can be a prayer of commission, a Bible passage, or words of encouragement. Blessings can be spoken over a child for the purpose of declaring God's protection, joy, and wisdom over him.

SCRIPTURE: 2 Corinthians 9:8

BLESSING:(Child's name), may God bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work. You can trust in God to support you in all things and to lean on Him to sustain you when you are tired and weary.

LESSON THREE

IDENTITY

GOD'S WORD

King Jesus

GOD STATEMENT: God Adopts SCRIPTURE: Ephesisans 1:5-8

Identity. Knowing who we are and where we come from is foundational. It allows us to stand firm and not swayed by the everchanging world around us. The disciple Matthew understood this. His gospel, establishes the liniage of Jesus from the royal line of Kind David and reminds us of Isaiah 9:6-7. God had a plan from the begining of time to make Jesus King of the Jews, but He didn't stop there, He made a way for us to be adopted into this royal family! Read Ephesians 1:5-8 as a family and discuss the following questions.

⁵ God decided in advance to adopt us into his own family by bringing us to himself through Jesus Christ. This is what he wanted to do, and it gave him great pleasure. ⁶ So we praise God for the glorious grace he has poured out on us who belong to his dear Son. ⁷ He

is so rich in kindness and grace that he purchased our freedom with the blood of his Son and forgave our sins.
⁸ He has showered his kindness on us, along with all wisdom and understanding. (New Living Translation)

DISCUSSION:

- 1. What does it mean to be King?
- 2. Remember, as a believer in Jesus Christ you have a new identity. In the above passage, what does it say we recieve as adopted children of God?
- 3. How does this truth help you to stand strong in this world?

2 GAME TIME Who Am I?

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

· Gift bag

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- 1. Give the youngest player the empty gift bag.
- 2. The player now finds an item in the house (preferably another room) and places it in the gift bag. They can not show the item to anyone.
- Have the member return with the hidden item and accept six yes or no questions. If the item is guesed, give the guesser the bag.
- 4. Continue playing until everyone has had a turn.







3 A Work of Art WORSHIP RESPONSE

Isn't it fantastic to be adopted into the royal family of God? For this all play Worship Response enjoy using art as a way to respond in an attitude of worship toward God.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- · blank paper
- · markers or crayons
- paper strips
- jar
- timer

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- 1. Write the royal words below on the paper strips.
- 2. Fold the strips and place in the jar.
- 3. Choose one family member to be the artist.
- 4. The artist picks a royal word stlip out of the jar. Don't show the other players.
- 5. Now the artist will draw a picture of the royal word using only thier elbows.
- 6. Remaining players try to guess in one minute.
- 7. Hang your silly pictures in a high traffic area, like the mud room or bathroom, for a few days.
- 8. Each time you see them, smile and remember "you belong to God!"

Gifts for a King

GOD STATEMENT: God Gives Good Gifts
SCRIPTURE: Matthew 2:10-11 and Ephesians 1:12-14

The account of the Maji visiting young Jesus and presenting Him with wonderful gifts is glorious and it follows with the Maji worshiping Him. Last week, we spent time thinking of our identity in Christ. We are adopted into His forever family and God pours out grace and showers us with kindness. Do you see a characteristic of God here? He loves to give good gifts to remind us who we are, which results in praise to the King!

Read Ephesians 1:12-14 below to discover another gift God gives us:

¹² God's purpose was that we Jews who were the first to trust in Christ would bring praise and glory to God. ¹³ And now you Gentiles have also heard the truth, the Good News that God saves you. **And when you believed in Christ,**

He identified you as His own by giving you the Holy Spirit, whom He promised long ago. ¹⁴ The Spirit is God's guarantee that He will give us the inheritance He promised and that He has purchased us to be His own people. He did this so we would praise and glorify him.

DISCUSSION:

- Verse 14 above tells us God will give us the inheritance He promised. What does inheritance mean?
- 2. Who can recieve an inheritance?
- 3. How can you stand firm in an everychanging world knowing you are a child of the King and He will give you an inheritance?

Wrapping Party

As we approach December, let's enter with thankful hearts for the good gifts God gives. This simple create helps us remember his kindness and think on the specific gifts the Holy Spirit has given each believer.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- small boxes and or bags (Amazon boxes are great!)
- · holiday wrapping paper or fabric
- · scisors, tape, writing pen
- ribbon
- a copy of the spiritual gift labels found on page 27 or simply handwriten on the package.

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- Divide the boxes /bags and gift tags between family members.
- Let each person wrap thier boxes or decorate bags as desired
- 3. Divide the spiritual gifts listed on the next page among family members.



- 4. Handwrite the spiritual gift given on the gift tags and attach to your box or bag.
- Set all the gifts on display to use during Worship Response time.

· spiritual gift boxes

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- Have the spiritual gift descriptions available to read.
 Take turns allowing each family member to choose a box and give it to another member they think displays the gift!
- If you have a non reader, simply allow them to give a suprise gift to another family member. Read that gift aloud as a family.
- Remember, only the Holy Spirit gives spiritual gifts.
 This is simply a way to think of how God gives His children good gifts.
- 4. Isn't it fun to encourage and build one another up?

Glorious BLESSING

A blessing can be a prayer of commission, a Bible passage, or words of encouragement.

Blessings can be spoken over a child for the purpose of declaring God's protection, joy, and wisdom over him.

SCRIPTURE: Ephesians 1:18

BLESSING:(Child's name), I pray that your hearts will be flooded with light so that you can understand the confident hope He has given to you—His holy child who is His rich and glorious inheritance. This is your identity in Christ, firm and everlasting.

SPIRITUAL GIFTS:

LEADERSHIP: encouraging and helping others to build the kingdom of God (Romans 12:8 NIV)

ADMINISTRATION: helping with long term goals and remaining on task (1 Cor. 12:28 NIV)

TEACHING: instructing in truths and doctrines of God's Word

KNOWLEDGE: teaching and discipleship. The ability to learn, know and explain God's Word

WISDOM: the ability to discern works of the Holy Spirit and apply teaching and actions

PROPHECY: proclaiming the Word of God with boldness (Romans 12:6 NIV)

DISCERNMENT: being able to recognize the truth about a situation

EXHORTATION: people with this gift are enthusiastic about the Lord and they can motivate others

SHEPHERDING: looking out for the spiritual welfare of others

FAITH: trusting God to fulfill His plan. People with this gift are encouragers

EVANGELISM: the building up of the church so others will be led to Christ

APOSTLESHIP: motivators, church planters, missionaries: people who look beyond the walls

SERVICE/HELPS: helping those in need of practical assistance (Romans 12:7 NIV)

MERCY: The person with this gift shows acts of compassion

GIVING: People with this gift will give freely and with joy to further His kingdom

HOSPITALITY: Making people feel welcome, appreciated, and wanted (1 Peter 4:9 NIV)

— Interactive Advent Calendar -

December 1st was a much-anticipated date in our house. It was the day Christmas began! My parents would unveil the annual advent calendar they had created on a poster board with a small envelope for each day. Rather than being filled with candy, our advent calendar was full of family activities that gradually became annual traditions – things like making Christmas cookies, going for a drive to look at Christmas lights, roasting hot dogs in the fireplace, or having a wrestling match with Dad that became "Wassail and Wrestle!" These activities rarely cost much money, but they were always a memory-maker. So much so that I kept the tradition going for our kids (even through college), and now our kids are continuing for our grandkids!

You can also fill the pockets with miniature, meaningful holiday items (i.e. a tiny fabric Christmas tree, gold/tiny wise man character, a manger). These pockets can be adorned with festive designs, numbers, and colors, creating a charming visual display. Each day, you can make the countdown interactive and personal by having different people in your household take turns pulling the item from the pocket and discussing what that item means to them.

Gifts from God

At Christmas, we celebrate the gift that God gave us in His Son, Jesus. This is a fun family tradition that is a meaningful way to highlight how your guests are "gifts" to your family. It can be done after you have finished your Christmas meal but while everyone is still sitting around the table or after opening gifts together.

Write words on slips of paper (see below) and put into a mason jar. Next, have each person choose one from the jar. Then give everyone a moment to think about the person to their right and how that word relates to him/her. When ready have the oldest person start first. That person will turn to the person on their right and say, "You are a gift from God because you are ______" (filling in the blank with the word they chose from the jar). Then this person will think of a time or an instance that person reflected the word they just read. After that person is finished, the person who was just affirmed will do the same to the person on his/her right until everyone has had a chance to be affirmed.

For example, if someone chooses the word "patient" then they could say, "Grandma, you are a gift from God because you are patient. I can remember when I was baking with you one time, and I spilled flour everywhere. You were patient and helped me clean it up." Or if someone chooses the word "helpful" then they could say, "Carter, you are a gift from God because you are helpful. When you see that I am working hard around the house, you quickly respond by helping me get those things done, even when I don't ask you to." When everyone has been affirmed, ask someone in the room to thank God for the gift of each person in the room, and close in prayer.

PRALINE-PECAN FRENCH TOAST

MAKES 8 TO 10 SERVINGS

INGREDIENTS

- 1 (16-oz.) French bread loaf
- 1 cup firmly packed light brown sugar
- 1/3 cup butter, melted
- 2 tablespoons maple syrup
- 3/4 cup chopped pecans
- 4 large eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 cup 2% reduced-fat milk
- 2 tablespoons granulated sugar
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

PREPARATION

- 1. Cut 10 (1-inch-thick) slices of bread. Reserve remaining bread for another use.
- Stir together brown sugar and next 2 ingredients; pour into a lightly greased 13- x 9-inch baking dish. Sprinkle with chopped pecans.
- Whisk together eggs and next 4 ingredients.
 Arrange bread slices over pecans; pour egg mixture over bread. Cover and chill 8 hours.
- 4. Preheat oven to 350°. Bake bread 35 to 37 minutes or until golden brown. Serve immediately

PUMPKIN BARS WITH CREAM CHEESE FROSTING

Makes 12-14 servings

INGREDIENTS

- 16 oz Pumpkin Puree (canned pumpkin)
- 1 and ²/₃ cup granulated sugar
- 4 eggs
- · 1 cup vegetable oil
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp pumpkin pie spice
- 2 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 tsp salt

FROSTING

- 6 oz cream cheese, softened brick, not tub style cream cheese
- 1 cup butter, softened
- 4 cups powdered sugar
- 2 tsp vanilla extract

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- 2. In a large bowl, combine pumpkin, sugar, eggs and oil with an electric mixer until well combined.
- 3. Add flour, baking soda, baking powder, pumpkin pie spice, cinnamon and salt to the wet ingredients and mix by hand until just combined.
- 4. Pour batter into a 9×13" baking pan that has been sprayed with non-stick cooking spray.
- 5. Bake for approximately 30-40 minutes. Bars should be starting to set up but remember this is more like a brownie than a cake, it should seem a bit undercooked in the center, but not still be wet.
- 6. Remove from oven and allow to cool completely on a wire cooling rack.

FROSTING

- 7. Cream together cream cheese and butter until light and fluffy. Add in vanilla and mix until combined.
- 8. Add one cup of powdered sugar, and salt, and mix until well combined. Then add remaining powdered sugar and mix until well combined.
- 9. Spread frosting over bars. Slice and serve.

GOD STATEMENT: Jesus is the Good News **SCRIPTURE:** Luke 2:1-21, John 10:10

A long time ago a young woman, Mary, and her husband, Joseph, made a journey. They had to leave their home in Nazareth and travel 90 miles on foot to Bethlehem because Ceaser was taking a census. The young woman was pregnant, about to give birth at any moment, to the baby who was the Messiah, the King of Kings, the Lord of Lords, the Almighty King of the Universe. The One who hung the stars in the sky and knows the exact number of grains of sand around the world would be coming into the world as a baby. All God, all man, all for us.

LEGEND OF THE CANDY CANE

Look at the candy cane, what do you see? Stripes that are red, like the blood shed for me. White for my Savior who is sinless and pure! "J" is for Jesus, my Lord that's for sure! Turn it around and a staff you will see Jesus my shepherd was born for me!

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- 1 chenille stick
- · red and white pony beads

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- 1. Bend up the bottom of the chenille stem so the bead doesn't fall off.
- 2. Put 1 red pony bead on the chenille stem. Then, put 1 white bead on the chenille stem.

- Continue alternating between the red and white beads until you reach the end of your chenille stem.

- 5. Bend the top part of the beaded chenille stem into a cane shape.

2. Place the stable: "Lord, make this home a place that welcomes you and puts you first."

Place the animals: "Jesus, let humility—like that of your surroundings at your birth—be a characteristic of my life."

4. Add Mary and Joseph: "As Mary and Joseph prayed, let me act according to your will."

5. Place the infant Jesus figure: "Gracious Christ, as you took on human flesh, were born in a stable, and laid in a manger, please be with me through this season in a special and enduring way."

6. Place the angel or angels: "Let peace on earth and goodwill toward all multiply among me and my family this Christmas season."

7. Place the shepherds: "Lord, make me as excited as those shepherds were to welcome You and spread the news about You."

8. Place the wise men (in the scene or at some distance): "As the magi came to worship and present their gifts to you, let my life be acceptable in your sight, Lord, you are my strength and my redeemer."

This nativity prayer can be adapted to your circumstances. May this prayer change an otherwise routine part of this magical season into wonderful moments of prayer and meditation.

Joy To the World! GOD STATEMENT: Christ is Coming Again! SCRIPTURE: Psalm 98, Matthew 1:18-2:23

Pastor Issac Watts wrote Joy to the World in 1719. Most people believe that he wrote it about the birth of Christ making it a wonderful Christmas carol, however Watts wrote the poem based on Psalm 98, Christ's second coming. "Joy to the World, the Lord is come. Let earth receive her King".

Psalm 98 says, "Sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things; his right hand and his holy arm have worked salvation for him. The Lord has made His salvation known and revealed His righteousness to the nations. He has remembered His love and His faithfulness to Israel; all the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God. Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth, burst into jubilant song with music; make music to the Lord with the harp, with the harp and the

sound of singing, with trumpets and the blast of the ram's horn-shout for joy before the Lord, the King. Let the sea resound, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it. Let the rivers clap their hands, let the mountains sing together for joy; let them sing before the Lord, for He comes to judge the earth. He will judge the world in righteousness and the peoples with equity."

DISCUSSION:

- 1. What similarities do you see between Psalm 98 and the lyrics to Joy to the World?
- 2. What does it mean when we sing "the Lord is come"
- 3. What is your favorite holiday song and why?
