GOD'S WORD Adventure Awaits

GOD STATEMENT: God Uses Community

SCRIPTURE: Colossians 4:2-6

The New Testament introduces Paul as a young pharisee who believed persecuting followers of Jesus Christ is what God wanted. One day, Paul's world turned upside down. Jesus appeared to him and offered the opportunity to trade in his religious robes for adventure clothes! Paul was all in.

For the next thirty years, he lived a life on mission, full of wild adventure. He became a church planter, mentor, and encourager to churches scattered all around the Mediterranean Sea. Toward the end of his missionary life, Paul sat in a Roman prison thinking of his FAITH COMMUNITY in Colossi. Read Colossians 4:2-6 and use the discussion questions below to discover what this faithful man in bondage wanted to tell those he loves.

DISCUSSION

- What are the requests Paul makes of the church?
- 2. How do these requests remind us to rely on our FAITH COMMUNITY?
- 3. Why do you think he wrote about acting wisely in how they acted toward outsiders?
- 4. How does your FAITH COMMUNITY act toward the lost world?

2 Gather Together

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Outdoor space with small sticks
- One Dollar Store 8.5 x 11 frame with glass per family
- Hot glue gun and plenty of glue sticks.

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- Have one or two adults team up with kids as the stick scavengers, and designate one or two adults as hot glue handlers.
- Challenge the scavengers to gather enough small sticks to glue around the frame edge and bring them back to the handlers.
- 3. Cheer the handlers on as they glue the sticks around the edge of the frame.
- 4. Admire your Faith Community Frame and keep for Worship Response!

TWIST

- If your community group meets at night, consider gathering the sticks ahead and placing them indoors as a scavenger hunt.
- If your yard doesn't have sticks, plan ahead and visit a park to find these little treasures. Hide them outside or inside before group.
- If your crew is competitive, set a timer and let the teams race to find the sticks and the handlers to glue them on. Be sure to cheer and tell the other



3 WORSHIP RESPONSE Faith in Action

Paul was focused on sharing the Gospel message with as many as possible, and he didn't try to do it alone. He encouraged other believers to work together and impact the unbelieving world for Christ. We can do that too. What if your community group put this discovery into action by hosting a block party to meet and reach others?

The next four lesson will help guide your group in planning a neighborhood block party. Let's spend time in this Worship Response devoted to prayer, watching where the Lord leads and being thankful for His direction. Get ready for adventure!

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- · Pen and paper

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- Begin with prayer. Ask the Lord for His direction and thoughts concerning a possible neighborhood outreach. Ask Him to bring to mind details that need planning in advance.

- 3. Write your to-do list on paper and place inside the empty frame and place in a visible place.
- 4. Check off completed tasks with the dry erase marker to make sure your group is ready.

LESSON TWO

FAITH COMMUNITY

GOD'S WORD 12 Baskets Full

In the environment of FAITH COMMUNITY, we often remember this phrase:

"Our love for each other reflects the love we have received from God."

Have you ever wondered who our love reflects to? Maybe this radiant glow draws others to Christ, and this was the heart lesson Jesus taught the twelve disciples when feeding the five thousand. **Pause to read Luke 9:12.**

It was the end of the day. Everyone was hungry and the disciples began to problem solve in a normal manner. Send the people away. Let them take care of their own problem. This was just expected. But Jesus took the opportunity to lead this small FAITH COMMUNITY on a new adventure of caring for others when it's not easy. Whew! Talk about a curve ball! Jesus invited His followers to join Him in meeting the need,. **He is the same today.** Will you join Him in His miraculous work?

GOD STATEMENT: Jesus Invites Us

SCRIPTURE: Luke 9:12-17

Read Luke 9:12-17 and use the discussion questions to dig up a beautiful Truth treasure.

DISCUSSION

- 1. Who did Jesus ask to feed the huge, hungry crowd?
- 2. Do you think the disciples were surprised and confused about how to feed the people?
- 3. How did they try to feed them?
- 4. How did Jesus respond?
- 5. Do you trust Jesus to provide for your FAITH COMMUNITY to serve others?

2 Pitcher Up!

"They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basket fulls of broken pieces that were left over."

Think of that! After the disciples accepted the invitation and participated in their leader's work, they were satisfied to overflowing. Let's play a game that helps us remember the fullness of the LORD.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Two teams of at least two players each
- Empty basket for each team
- Balled up scrap paper (at least 12 balls per team)

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- 1. Divide into two teams.
- 2. Establish a pitcher's mound and a catcher's mark at least 10 feet apart (more for a challenge).

- 3. At the same time, have both pitchers throw the paper balls toward their catcher.
- 4. Catchers try to catch the ball and fill their baskets.
- 5. The team with the most balls wins!



3 WORSHIP RESPONSE AN INVITATION

This week, let's thank Jesus for inviting our FAITH COMMUNITY to join Him. Allow any who would like to speak their thankful praise outloud. If your group is planning a neighborhood block party, spend time making the invitations during Worship Response.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Colorful paper plates (enough for all the households you plan to invite)
- Printed invitation
- Scissors
- Glue sticks
- Hole puncher
- String

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- Consider printing invitations before your group.
 Invitations can be approximately 4in x 5in or four to a page.
- 2. Let your children cut out the invitations and glue one invitation to the center of each plate.
- 3. Punch two holes at the top of each plate.
- 4. Cut 12-inch sections of string and run through the two holes.
- 5. Tie string at top to make a loop that will hang on door knobs.
- 6. Divide the plates between homegroup members to keep and pray over. Bring to next group meeting.

SERVING

Toda word Not Done Yet

GOD STATEMENT: Jesus Freely Serves

SCRIPTURE: Galatians 5:13

Donita was retired. She had worked for decades as an elementary school teacher and was now excited to start a new chapter in life. Working on old furniture, riding her bike, spending time with the grandkids. These were things she was ready to enjoy. But as her dreamy list was written, the Lord gently asked her to remember to keep serving Him.

Instead of growing selfish with free time, she was humbled the Lord still wanted her to partner with Him!

"Yes Lord", she eagerly answered. Soon after, she was invited to teach an Afghan woman how to read and write English. This precious lady served a false god, and Donita knew it was important to bring the light of Christ to the family.

Each week they faithfully met to learn new letters and practice speaking, and one day, she may ask Donita "Why do you help me?" Donita is ready to give the reason for her hope, Jesus! Paul reminds us of this truth in Galatians 5:13.

"You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love."

What a great adventure we're on when we follow where the Lord leads us.

DISCUSSION

- 1. What does it mean to indulge the flesh?
- 2. Why do you think God warns us not to become selfish?
- 3. Is the Lord showing you a way to serve others?



2 Service Race

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Outdoor space
- Starting line and turn around at least 20 ft. apart
- · Runners and servers
- · Serving tray
- Five or more plastic cups 3/4 full of water
- Pitcher full of water
- Timer

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- All players are runners except one, who will be the server.
- 2. Runners line up at the staring line.
- 3. Set a timer for an amount of time players think they can beat.
- 4. Place five cups of water on the tray, and tell the first player to run when the timer starts from the start line to the turn around holding the tray of water.
- 5. Player must try not to spill the water cups, but if they do, the server runs to fill the spilled cup.
- 6. The server then switches places with the runner, becoming the new runner. The original runner is now the server.
- 7. Try to have all runners complete the race before the time runs out.

3 A Purposeful Walk

Summertime is a perfect time to take a walk. Gather your group and head out into the neighborhood with purpose. On this walk, pray over the houses you pass. If your group is hosting a block party, hang one of the invitations made last meeting on the front door of each home. When you return, enjoy the prepared-ahead-of-time watermelon slush to remind you the Lord is good. Serving others can be exciting and delightful.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Blender
- · Ice cube tray
- 4 cups of sweet watermelon
- 1 tbsp lime juice
- 1 tbsp lemonade plus extra for actual drink
- · 2 tbsp sugar

DAY BEFORE YOUR WALK

- Combine all ingredients in a blender and blend until smooth.
- 2. Pour juice into ice cube trays and freeze overnight.

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- 3. When ready, place 4 frozen cubes into each glass with a splash of lemonade and slightly thaw.
- 4. Stir the drink with the mixture is slightly slushy.
- 5. Serve immediately.



4 Mindset of Christ

LESSON FOUR

SERVING

GOD'S WORD Serving: Super ME

GOD STATEMENT: Christ Sustains Me

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 40:28-31

Have you ever seen a superhero movie? I know of very few people who didn't want to be a superhero when they were little. Always coming in the nick of time to save the day, sacrificing themselves to rescue the citizens, and beating the super villain. Superheroes are servants to the people. As we get older, we start accumulating more responsibilities. It is all we can do sometimes to finish our own workload, let alone volunteer to help others. If we don't take a break at times, we can become overwhelmed, overly tired, and burnt out.

Burnout happens when we are constantly working, stressed, and busy without any downtime. The results of burnout are extreme exhaustion, being irritable, lack of motivation, and lack of productivity. This can, of course, cause issues at home, work, and/or school. We may not be mighty superheroes, but we serve a mighty God who is super. He is willing to take our anxiety and stress upon Himself if we give it to Him. Philippians 4:6-7 says, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

To avoid burnout, we must nurture our connection with God and allow God to work through us and sustain us. We can do this by having a regular devotional time. Isaiah 40:28-31 says, "Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom. He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint."

Another way to avoid burnout is to fuel your body as well as your mind, and take some downtime to do what you love. Get out and take a walk and enjoy God's creation. Draw, color, or paint a picture of your favorite things. Craft or spend some time doing your favorite hobby. Taking an hour out of your day to get your body moving or spending time doing

something you love is a great way to refresh your mind and renew your spirit. And remember, "The Lord himself goes before you and will be with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged." Deuteronomy 31:8

- What are some things you do or can do to serve 2.
- What are some things you like to do to help avoid burnout?

WHAT YOU'LL NEED


- Bible

WHAT YOU'LL DO

Every superhero needs a secret fortress! This can be used for quiet time, devotionals, and/or defeating the forces of evil as a family. You can make yours out of blankets and pillows.

Sometimes, God asks us to do unusual things that call us out of our comfort zone. One day, Matt was on vacation and taking the elevator down to the lobby when he sensed the Lord asking him to do a handstand in the elevator! "How silly, God," Matt thought. But the Lord kept asking him to do it in obedience. So Matt, who could hold a great handstand, flipped upside down for the rest of the ride. When the electric doors slid open, a man stood on the other side. His jaw dropped. This man was talking to God and sarcastically told Him the only way he'd believe is if the elevator doors opened and someone was in a handstand! Matt's obedience to make himself vulnerable led to another man's belief in Jesus.

This is not a new story. In fact, we read about another odd story in Acts 10:9-16. Read the account outloud as a family. If you have time, finish out the chapter to see how Peter's obedience led to others believing in Christ.

DISCUSSION

- In both stories, why do you think God asked these men to step out in faith?
- Has God asked you to step out in faith before? 2.
- How did it grow your relationship with Him? 3.

LESSON SIX

OUT OF THE COMFORT ZONE

Mighty to Save

The best adventures are ones you weren't completely sure you could actually do. Did you climb a mountain, or run a marathon, skydive, or camp out ALL NIGHT? Take a moment to share a past adventure where the Lord helped you overcome a fear or big obstacle. It's great to look back and remember how the Lord takes us places we never thought possible.

That's exactly what happened to the Israelite nation as they left Egypt. They had seen how mighty God was when He sent the Egyptian plagues, but they experienced Him fighting for them as they faced the Red Sea. Either way they turned was certain death. God could have saved His people by building a high wall, or simply scattering the Egyptian army. Instead, He took the Hebrew people on a great adventure, THROUGH the water, OUT OF THE COMFORT ZONE.

GOD STATEMENT: God is Warrior

SCRIPTURE: Exodus 14

3 WORSHIP RESPONSE Celebrate!

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- · Enough celebration gear for each member.
- · Gear can be anything you have around the house like pom poms, inexpensive party poppers, or a cow bell.

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- 1. Place items in a pile
- Circle up around the celebration pile.
- Allow each member to chose an item
- 4. Take turns going around your celebration circle giving praise to God. "He is The Mighty Warrior" is an example.
- 5. After each praise, cheer with the celebration gear.

The Foreigner

His commitment to care for the foreigner paved the way for a poor young lady named Ruth to support her mother-in-law. This Moabite woman would soon become his wife and the mother of Obed. Obed is the grandfather of King David, and Jesus comes from this very lineage! Isn't it


SCRIPTURE: 1 John 4:17-18

3 Actions and Truth



A BLESSING BIESSED

LESSON EIGHT

RESPONSIBILITY

Restoration

GOD STATEMENT: God Sends Us SCRIPTURE: 2 Corinthians 5:17-21

In the beginning, when God created the heavens and the earth and all that is in them, it was perfect and good. Adam and Eve had responsibility in the garden of Eden, and they had a right relationship with God. Sadly, that was broken when sin entered the world through Adam's disobedience. Our hearts hurt when we think of the separation between God and man. Yet, there is good news, God immediately set a plan into motion to reconcile us to Himself. Jesus! 2 Corinthians 5:17-19 tells us:

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come. The old has gone, the new is here! All this is from God, who reconciled us to Himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation. That God was reconciling the world to Himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them.


And He has committed to us the message of reconciliation."

God has made a way for us to be with Him again. All praises to Him. But wait, there's more. God invites you to join in the work. We have a new responsibility to make an appeal to the lost world to be reconciled to Him.

Read 2 Corinthians 5:20-21 and reflect on the questions below.

DISCUSSION

- 1. What is an ambassador?
- 2. Why did Jesus have to become sin for us?
- 3. What excites you about your responsibility as ambassador?





We can worship many ways. Sometimes we sing, sometimes we pray, and often the words come straight from God's Word. It's important to hide God's Word in our heart's and this week our challenge is to add 2 Corinthians 5:20 to memory. On a blank sheet of paper, write or type the Scripture. Then cut up the paper so each word or phrase has it's own piece. Now, lay them all out so everyone can see the Scripture. Try saying it as a group three times. Then, have an adult hide one or two pieces away and recite the verses again. Continue until all pieces are gone and you've hidden the Word in your heart.

BLESSING:(Child's name), may you remember that God has given you the ministry of reconciliation. May you boldly tell the world about Jesus wherever He sends you. You are His delightful ministry partner.

10 ENVIRONMENTS

The order of the 10 Environments listed coincides with the monthly distribution of this resource.

I STORYTELLING

"God has a big story, and I can be a part of it!"

The power of The Big God Story impacts our lives by giving us an accurate and awe-inspiring perspective into how God has been moving throughout history. It is the story of redemption, salvation and hope and tells how I have been grafted into it by grace. It further compels us to see how God is using every person's life and is creating a unique story that deserves to be told for God's glory.

2 IDENTITY

"I belong to God, and He loves me!"

This environment highlights who we are in Christ. According to Ephesians 1, we have been chosen, adopted, redeemed, sealed, and given an inheritance in Christ all of which we did nothing to earn. This conviction allows children to stand firm against the destructive counteridentities the world will offer.

5 OUT OF THE COMFORT ZONE

"God transforms me when I step out in faith."

As children and students are challenged to step out of their comfort zone from an early age, they learn to experience a dependence on the Holy Spirit to equip and strengthen them beyond their natural abilities and desires. We believe this environment will cultivate a generation that, instead of seeking comfort, seeks a radical life of faith in Christ.

8

LOVE AND RESPECT

"God fills me with His love so I can give it away."

Without love, our faith becomes futile. This environment recognizes that children need an environment of love and respect in order to be free to both receive and give God's grace. Innate to this environment is the value that children are respected because they embody the image of God. We must speak to them, not αt them, and we must commit to an environment where love and acceptance are never withheld due to one's behavior.

3

FAITH COMMUNITY

"God's family cares for each other and worships God together."

God designed us to live in community and to experience Him in ways that can only happen in proximity to one another. The faith community serves to create an environment to equip and disciple parents, to celebrate God's faithfulness, and to bring a richness of worship through tradition and rituals, which offer children an identity. Our love for each other reflects the love we have received from God.

6 RESPONSIBILITY

"God has entrusted me with the things and people He created around me."

This environment captures the ability to take ownership for one's life, gifts, and resources before God. A child must be challenged to take responsibility for his or her brothers and sisters in Christ, as well as for those who are spiritually lost. Our hope is that the Holy Spirit will use this environment to allow each child to understand that God has entrusted His world to us.

9

KNOWING

"God knows me, and I can know Him."

Nothing could be more important than knowing and being known by God. We live in a world that denies absolute truth, and yet God's Word offers just that. As we create an environment that upholds and displays God's truth, we give children a foundation based on knowing God, knowing His Word, and a relationship with Him through Christ. God is holy, mighty, and awesome, and yet He has chosen to make Himself known to us!

4

SERVING

"Asks the question, 'What needs to be done?"

This posture of the heart asks the question, "What needs to be done?" It allows the Holy Spirit to cultivate a sensitivity to others and focuses on a cause bigger than one individual life. It helps fulfill the mandate that as Christfollowers we are to view our lives as living sacrifices that we generously give away!

COURSE CORRECTION

"When I get off track, God offers me a path of healing."

This environment flows out of Hebrews 12:11-13 and is the direct opposite of punishment. Instead, biblical discipline for a child encompasses a season of pain, the building up in love, and a vision of a corrected path for the individual with the purpose of healing at its core.

MODELING

"I see Christ in others, and they can see Him in me."

Biblical content needs a practical living expression in order for it to be spiritually impacting. This environment serves as a hands-on example of what it means for children to put their faith into action. Modeling puts flesh on faith and reminds us that others are watching to see if we live what we believe.
