

How to Use

- 1 Start by deciding on a day and time that works well for your entire family. It can be an evening around a meal, breakfast on a Saturday, or a break between sporting events.

10 ENVIRONMENTS

The order of the 10 Environments listed coincides with the monthly distribution of this resource.

1 STORYTELLING

"God has a big story, and I can be a part of it!"

The power of The Big God Story impacts our lives by giving us an accurate and awe-inspiring perspective into how God has been moving throughout history. It is the story of redemption, salvation and hope, and tells how I have been grafted into it by grace. It further compels us to see how God is using every person's life and is creating a unique story that deserves to be told for God's glory.

2 IDENTITY

"I belong to God, and He loves me!"

This environment highlights who we are in Christ. According to Ephesians 1, we have been chosen, adopted, redeemed, sealed, and given an inheritance in Christ ... all of which we did nothing to earn. This conviction allows children to stand firm against the destructive counter-identities the world will offer.

3

FAITH COMMUNITY

"God's family cares for each other and worships God together."

God designed us to live in community and to experience Him in ways that can only happen in proximity to one another. The faith community serves to create an environment to equip and disciple parents, to celebrate God's faithfulness, and to bring a richness of worship through tradition and rituals, which offer children an identity. Our love for each other reflects the love we have received from God.

5 OUT OF THE COMFORT ZONE

"God transforms me when I step out in faith."

As children and students are challenged to step out of their comfort zone from an early age, they learn to experience a dependence on the Holy Spirit to equip and strengthen them beyond their natural abilities and desires. We believe this environment will cultivate a generation that, instead of seeking comfort, seeks a radical life of faith in Christ.

6 RESPONSIBILITY

"God has entrusted me with the things and people He created around me."

This environment captures the ability to take ownership for one's life, gifts, and resources before God. A child must be challenged to take responsibility for his or her brothers and sisters in Christ, as well as for those who are spiritually lost. Our hope is that the Holy Spirit will use this environment to allow each child to understand that God has entrusted His world to us.

3

LOVE & RESPECT

"God fills me with His love so I can give it away."

Without love, our faith becomes futile. This environment recognizes that children need an environment of love and respect in order to be free to both receive and give God's grace. Innate to this environment is the value that children are respected because they embody the image of God. We must speak to them, not at them, and we must commit to an environment where love and acceptance are never withheld due to one's behavior.

9

KNOWING

"God knows me, and I can know Him."

Nothing could be more important than knowing and being known by God. We live in a world that denies absolute truth, and yet God's Word offers just that. As we create an environment that upholds and displays God's truth, we give children a foundation based on knowing God, knowing His Word, and a relationship with Him through Christ. God is holy, mighty, and awesome, and yet He has chosen to make Himself known to us!

4 SERVING

"Asks the question, 'What needs to be done?""

This posture of the heart asks the question, "What needs to be done?" It allows the Holy Spirit to cultivate a sensitivity to others and focuses on a cause bigger than one individual life. It helps fulfill the mandate that as Christfollowers we are to view our lives as living sacrifices that we generously give away!

/ COURSE CORRECTION

"When I get off track, God offers me a path of healing."

This environment flows out of Hebrews 12:11-13 and is the direct opposite of punishment. Instead, biblical discipline for a child encompasses a season of pain, the building up in love, and a vision of a corrected path for the individual with the purpose of healing at its core.

10

MODELING

"I see Christ in others, and they can see Him in me."

Biblical content needs a practical living expression in order for it to be spiritually impacting. This environment serves as a hands-on example of what it means for children to put their faith into action. Modeling puts flesh on faith and reminds us that others are watching to see if we live what we believe.

God is Good

SCRIPTURE

1 Samuel 1:1-19-2:11

This story in the Old Testament is a journey of grief in the life of Hannah. Her desire was to have a son, but year after year she was denied her greatest desire and found much turmoil while living a barren life. She found herself weeping, crying, and praying to God, pouring her heart out to Him time and time again. While her story ended in receiving the gift of her son, Samuel, she still had to endure a difficult journey to her dream being fulfilled. We see that the Lord was good to Hannah despite her pain. We can choose to trust that He is good to us, too.

DISCUSS

- What areas of grief do you need to pour out to the Lord?
- What breaks your heart or makes you sad? How can you share that emotion with him?
- What stops you from trusting that God is good, even when it doesn't seem like He's listening or answering your prayers?

PRAY

Lord, remind us of your goodness this week. Help us to see that you are a trustworthy Father who cares about the griefs and aches of our hearts. Spirit, guide us as we process difficult things together as a family.

WEEK TWOSTORYTELLING

GOD STATEMENT

God is Just

• SCRIPTURE

I 11ke 10:1-10

In ancient Israel, the tax collectors were looked down upon by most people in society. They were greedy workers who would steal or manipulate for financial gain. In this story, we see Jesus not only interact with Zacchaeus, a tax collector, but Jesus engaged with him in a deeper way; He wanted to visit Zacchaeus's home. He had become the "guest of a sinner" (v. 7). Jesus, in all His goodness, kindness, and love, is also the one who decided where and when justice came into others' lives. The people who watched this meeting made judgements about what it meant about Jesus. But in the end, Jesus had such an impact on Zacchaeus that he turned his life around and gave back to the community he had taken from. The justice of the Lord was happening in the life of a tax collector.

DISCUSS

- Have you ever felt the need to bring justice down on other people?
- In what areas of your life can you choose to trust God—the one who is perfectly good and full of justice?
- How have you seen the justice of God in your own life?

PRAY

Lord, thank you that you are a kind and powerful God who watches over us. Would you give us the strength to let go of the control we desire when we think of justice? Jesus, give us the gift of faith as we choose to trust that you will bring your righteous justice to this world.

GOD STATEMENT

God is Knowable

• SCRIPTURE

Philippians 3:7-11

Paul had a lot going for him in life. He had all the attributes one could want, and his qualifications and accolades assured him a comfortable, enviable life. But something happened that made him willing to throw all of it aside, counting all his credentials as worthless as used paper only to be thrown in the trash. Paul met Jesus, and that encounter transformed Paul and shifted what was important to him. After meeting Jesus, Paul couldn't get enough; he needed more. Paul was so focused on Jesus that he set aside his desires and abilities so he could know Jesus better. It is really a remarkable thing that God can be known by us. When Paul encountered the risen Jesus on the road to Damascus, it changed all his priorities.

DISCUSS

- What are some of your best attributes, qualities, or accomplishments?
- Is knowing God as important to you as it was for Paul?
- What is something you may have to give up to know God better?

PRAY

Jesus, I want to know you like Paul knew you. Help me see the things in my life that are making it hard for me to know you better. I pray that you will reveal yourself to me this week, and help me be aware of the moments when you show up. I love you so much. Thank you for letting me know you.

WEEK FOUR STORYTELLING

- GOD STATEMENT
- God Establishes Purpose
- SCRIPTURE

God spoke to a young man named Jeremiah to call him to ministry as a prophet.

A prophet is someone who tells people what God is saying to them, and Jeremiah worried he was too young and inexperienced to speak to the people on God's behalf. God told Jeremiah that He had planned for Jeremiah to be a prophet even before he was born. God had a plan, and He needed someone who was willing to obey Him and follow wherever He led. Because Jeremiah trusted God, God was able to use him to speak to the people. Even when we do not know what God is planning, we can be confident because we know who God is.

DISCUSS

- Can you think of a time when God has spoken to you or revealed something to you?
- How does it make you feel that God had a plan for Jeremiah before he was even born?
- How does knowing God help us when we are facing uncertain situations in our lives?

PRAY

God, we are humbled by the fact that you are God, and we are not. Help us trust you and your plan and help us be obedient when we hear you calling. Thank you for speaking to us and letting us participate with you in bringing about your plan. Make us sensitive to your voice in our hearts so we can hear when you speak to us. Amen.



Sweet & Sour Meatballs


A quick, simple, savory family dinner

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Turkey or chicken meatballs (frozen food section of the market)
- Cooked rice
- · Steamed vegetables for a side
- 1 cup apricot preserves
- 2 Tbsp. aioli garlic mustard sauce
- 2 tsp. coconut aminos
- 1 tsp. crushed red pepper to taste (can be spicy)

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- 1. Prepare the meatballs and rice then set aside.
- 2. In a saucepan combine apricot preserves, aioli, aminos, and red peppers (optional).
- 3. Whisk over medium heat until it almost reaches a simmer.
- 4. Remove from heat.
- 5. Plate your rice, meatballs, and vegetables.
- 5. Drizzle the sauce over meatballs and rice.



SPRING TREATS

Your kids will have a great time creating these crunchy, salty-and-sweet Spring Treats. Allow your children to put their own creative stamp on these by choosing the colors and imagining their own Spring scenes.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

PRETZEL BUTTERFLIES:

- 16 small pretzel sticks
- 8 caramel candies
- 16 knot-shaped pretzels

MAY FLOWERS:

- 8 pretzel snaps
- 8 bright white candy melts
- 56 M&Ms

WHAT YOU'LL DO

PRETZEL BUTTERFLIES:

- Unwrap the caramels and roll each into a ball shape using your hands.
- 2. Stick 1 knot-shaped pretzel into each side of the caramel for wings.
- 3. Stick 2 pretzel sticks in the front of the caramel for the antennae.

MAY FLOWERS:

- 4. Place pretzel snaps on a plate.
- 5. Cover each pretzel with a bright white candy melt
- 6. Place the plate in the microwave and heat for approximately 45 to 50 seconds (You want the candy melts to be melted enough to press the M&M's into but not so melted that the candy melt loses its shape).
- 7. Press an M&M into the center of the melted candy melt, "M" side down.
- 8. Create the flower petals by placing 6 different-colored M&M's around the central M&M.

After you have made your butterflies and flowers, encourage your children to create a spring scene and add the treats to their drawings!

FAMILY TIME RECIPE



This is a fun recipe to prepare with your kids.
Encourage kids to participate in the varying degrees they are able. Littles can help measure, pour, and mix while older kids could be the griddle master.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 tbsp. granulated sugar
- 1/4 tsp. kosher salt
- 2 large eggs
- 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup whole milk
- 1 tbsp. unsalted butter
- Toppings: powdered sugar, fruit, peanut butter, Nutella, or a savory filling

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- 1. In a large bowl, whisk flour, granulated sugar, and salt to combine.
- 2. Create a well in center of dry ingredients. Crack eggs into well.
- 3. Gradually pour in milk, whisking from the center to incorporate dry ingredients.
- 4. Let stand at room temperature until slightly bubbly on top, 15 to 20 minutes.
- 5. In a small skillet over medium heat, melt butter.
- 6. Drop about 1/4 cup batter into pan, then swirl pan to coat bottom in a thin, even layer.
- 7. Cook until just set, about 2 minutes, then flip and continue to cook until second side is golden brown, about 1 minute more.
- 8. Repeat with remaining batter.
- Dust crêpes with powdered sugar or fill the center with your favorite fillings, roll and serve.

CREATION COLLAGE

GENESIS 1:25

BEFORE YOU START:

This month we are reflecting on knowing God and being known by Him. God knows me, and I can know Him.

The God of creation, every creature, every part of our earth, and every human wants to know us! He cares about each and every one of us. What is even more incredible is that He wants us to know Him. He wants to have a relationship with every person He created.

Spend some time with your family being in awe of God's creation-everything from sunsets to bugs, landscapes, food, people, music, love, butterflies, and flowers! Create a collage of God's creation and hang it up somewhere so you can look at it often and be reminded of our ability to know God.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- cardstock or construction paper
- magazines and/or printed pictures from the internet
- scissors
- glue
- markers or colored pencils

WHAT YOU'LL DO:

- Make a list of different things around your house, neighborhood, and city that God has created.
- Gather magazines or print out pictures from the internet to use.
- · Carefully cut out pictures of creation.
- Arrange the pictures on your paper to find the best spot for everything.
- · Glue your pictures onto the paper.
- Enjoy your creation and place it somewhere you can be reminded of God's creation.

DISCUSSION:

- What do you love about our planet?
- What do you love about how God made you?
- · How do you feel when you think about how God wants you to know Him?


PRAY:

1 PETER 2:9 AND 1 JOHN 5:20

One of the greatest truths we can teach our children is to know God and be known by Him. We get to create a foundation based on knowing God, His Word, and having a relationship with Him through His Son, Jesus. The Scriptures for this month tell us that God is good, just, loving, and faithful. Through His Word and the Holy Spirit, He makes Himself known to us.

As a family, share some of the attributes you have learned about God by creating God statements together. Start by making a list of the things you know are true about Him. Just as God's Word reveals who God is to us, you will create special cards to reveal your God statements to each other.

To get started, set up a creative worship space around the table. Read aloud the Scripture passages to begin discussion about how you know who God is.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- · White Cardstock
- White Crayons
- Colored Markers
- A poster or whiteboard to display your God statements

WHAT YOU'LL DO:

 Create a God statement display on the poster/ whiteboard. Write GOD IS.... in large letters.

- Write a word that describes God from the scriptures you have read on the white cardstock with a white crayon. Make sure to press hard to leave a heavy layer of crayon wax on the card.
- Add additional words that you know about God. Example: caring, truth, my friend, with me.
- Color over the white cardstock with a colored marker to reveal what you know about God from the scriptures you read together as a family.

Jesus Reveals

• SCRIPTURE

John 9:1-12

Jesus and his disciples had been traveling, performing miracles and proclaiming that Jesus was the Messiah. People with physical, spiritual, and emotional trauma were seeking Jesus to come and heal them. They came across a blind man—a well-known beggar who had been helpless and hopeless since birth. The question was how Jesus would react to the blind beggar?

DISCUSS

- How did Jesus explain why the man was blind?
- What did Jesus do to restore the man's sight?
- What does siloam mean?
- · How did people respond to the blind man who was now healed?
- In what ways are we spiritually blind?

PRAY

Jesus, we recognize that you are the only one who can open our eyes to who you are and what you have planned for us. We thank you that you don't forget about us, and that you go to great lengths to save us! God, help us know the areas of our lives where we are spiritually blind to the people you are shaping us into. Open our eyes! In the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, Amen.

GOD STATEMENT

God Is Healer

SCRIPTURE

Luke 8:43-48

Desperation has a way of making us aware of what we need. Hunger amplifies the need for food. Thirst reveals our need for water. Loneliness magnifies the need for community. In John chapter 8 we are given a picture of a woman's life who needed healing. She had carried her ailment for 12 years and was desperate. Her faith informed her that, despite the failure of countless doctors, Jesus the Messiah had the power and authority to restore her. She was right. What we see in John 8 is a picture of what Jesus does for all who put their faith and trust in Him. He meets our needs and takes what was broken and makes it whole. That is who the people of God are in Christ.

DISCUSS

- What healed the woman? Was it touching Jesus's garment, or was it her faith in Jesus?

CHEESEBURGER EGG ROLLS



WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1 tsp. garlic powder
- 1/2 tsp. paprika
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. pepper
- 1 cup shredded cheese
- 1/4 cup chopped dill pickles
- Egg roll wrappers
- 1 large egg

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- Cook beef seasoned with garlic powder, paprika, salt and pepper.
- 2. Once the meat is browned, drain the grease and let cool.
- 3. Once the beef is cooled add the cheese and pickles.
- 4. Beat the egg with a splash of water to create an egg wash.
- 5. Brush the egg wash around the edges of the egg roll wrapper.
- 6. Add 1/4 cup of filling and wrap like a burrito.
- Add egg rolls to a lightly greased air fryer basket.
- 8. Cook on 400° for 5 minutes. Flip the egg rolls and cook for another 5 minutes.

1 PETER 2:9

WHAT YOU'LL DO:


- Draw (or print) a human silhouette.
